

Editorial Layout & Design

You have been contracted to design a full page layout for a national daily newspaper. Choosing from one of three themes, you will view the supplied artwork and prepare three design briefs before creating your layout using Adobe InDesign. You may only use the images provided, however you may edit them as you wish in Adobe Photoshop. You will be required to write all headlines, subheads, cutlines, and pull quotes. You may use place holder text (lorem ipsum) for the body copy. Make sure that your design clearly reflects the theme of your page. **Have fun!**

1. Choose your theme. The themes for the sections are: *“Life”, “Sports”, and “Travel”*.

Once you have selected your theme, transfer the artwork to your desktop and view it for inspiration. You must use at least three images on the page. There is no limit to the number of images you may use.

2. Write a design brief: You must complete a design brief for your layout, including two sketches.

The design brief must include:

- 1) The name of the newspaper
- 2) The name of the section (Sports, Travel, Arts & Entertainment, etc)
- 3) The number of articles that will be featured on the page (you must have at least two articles on the page)
- 4) The theme of your article (what is it about?), the writer’s name, and a sample headline
- 3) 2 Clear sketches based on a 5 column grid (you must show two options)

*****You must show me your design briefs before moving to the computer*****

3. Create your document in Adobe InDesign

Create a new document using the following specifications:

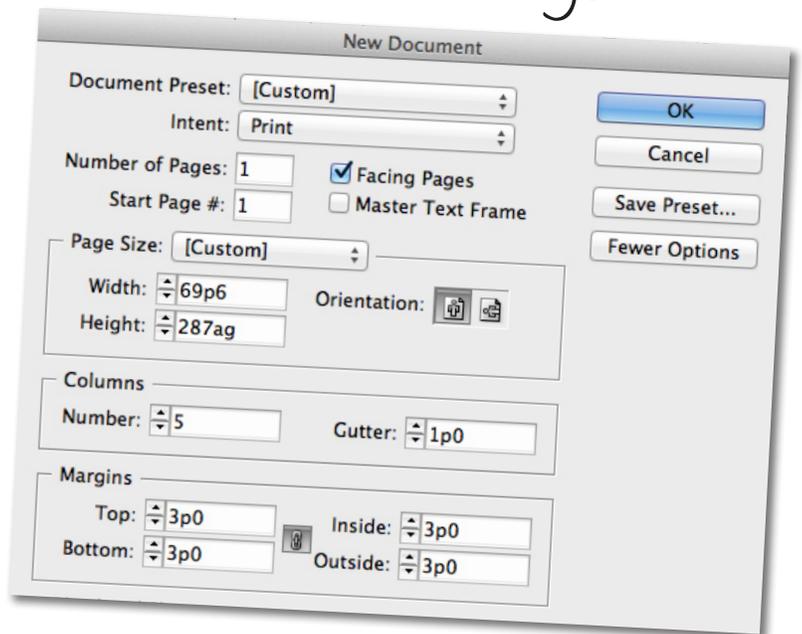
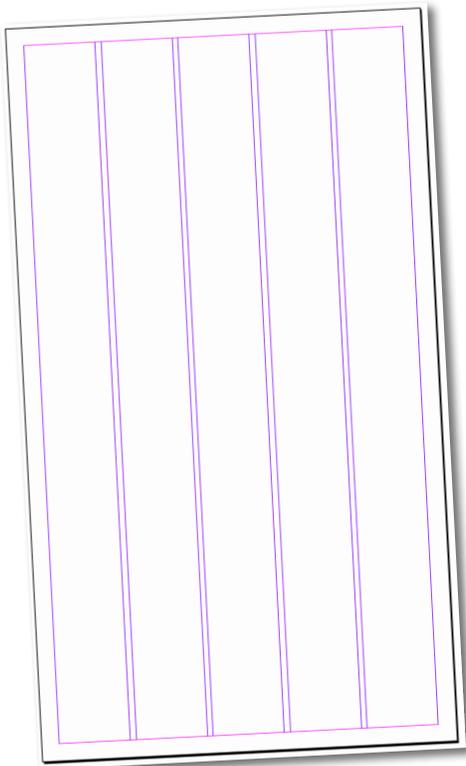
Document size: 69p6 x 287 ag

Columns: 5

Gutter width: 1p0

Margin: 3p0

4. The Images

You may only use the images provided however you may alter them as you wish. Experiment with filters, touch up or repair the images as necessary, or edit them as you see fit.

- Images must be 200 dpi and CMYK, and must be sized to 100%
- At least one image must use text wrap

5. The Layout

- You must place at least two articles on the page and decide which one will be your feature

The main article: Must include a headline, subhead, pull quote, cutline, and include a byline and drop cap

Secondary article(s): Must include a headline, pull quote, cut line and byline

Be creative with your writing! A good headline must grab the reader’s attention instantly!

Note: All headlines should be a different version of the same typeface (i.e. Myriad Bold 60pt. for the main headline, Myriad Regular 45 pt. for the second headline, Myriad Light 35 pt. for the third headline.)

6. Finished? Use this checklist!

- Grammar and spelling is correct (have someone proof read it)
- The principles of design were used (layout, white space, repetition, alignment, colour, typography)
- At least three (3) images were used. All images are 200 dpi, CMYK, at 100%
- At least one image uses text wrap
- Headlines are relevant to the theme of the page
